

2025 Election Year - Leadership Council Position Description

NSTA welcomes current members to serve a 3-year term on the Leadership Council. This year, the Council seeks nominations for leaders to represent and advocate on behalf of the following demographics:

- 1. Members who live and/or work in the following Districts, to serve as District Leaders:
 - District III: Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland
 - District V: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands
 - District IX: Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota
 - District XI: Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska
 - District XV: Idaho, Montana, Wyoming
 - District XVII: Alaska, Oregon, Washington
- 2. Members from the following constituencies, to serve as Division Leaders:
 - High School Science Teachers,
 - Science Coordinators/Supervisors, and
 - Postsecondary Instructors.

QUALIFICATIONS

The Nominations Committee will give preference to applicants with the following qualifications:

- Current NSTA member;
- Service on NSTA committee(s), state chapters, and/or other affiliated professional organizations;
- Possesses a growth mindset with an entrepreneurial outlook/innovative thinking;
- Willing to be an agent of change and move beyond status quo;
- Volunteer experience and/or community partnerships;
- Leadership experience with teams, committees, projects, programs, organizations, people, etc.; and
- Demonstrates strong communication and collaboration skills.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Build the NSTA community.
 - a. Division Leaders Chair a Division committee that works closely with NSTA to design and implement programs and create resources to help build a professional community. Each committee has a NSTA staff co-chair.

- b. District Directors Actively promote the benefits of the Association to ensure participation in programs and retention of existing members, and aid in recruiting new members for the Association.
- Guide NSTA Position Statements.
 - a. Be familiar with NSTA position statements,
 - b. Scan the external environment for important topics for which NSTA should create new statements, and
 - c. Oversee the drafting of position statements.
- 3. Support Strategic Partnerships.
 - a. Division Leaders Work closely with Affiliates associated with their committee to identify opportunities for collaboration.
 - b. District Leader Build close ties to the state organizations in their District to identify opportunities for collaboration.

Specific Responsibilities

- 1. Actively plan and participate in the National Congress on Science Education (June/July).
- 2. Actively participate in bi-monthly Leadership Council Meetings.
- 3. Division Leaders
 - a. Chair the division committee,
 - b. Set the agenda and hold regular meetings of their Division Committee (at least quarterly), and
 - c. Work with NSTA Affiliate representatives on their committee to develop synergistic partnerships.
- 4. District Leaders
 - a. Attend a state conference in their District annually.
 - b. Prepare/gather relevant content for the *District Dispatch* e-newsletter.

NOMINATION TIMELINE

- 1. Applicants must be available for an interview with the Nominations Committee between January 24 and February 20.
- 2. Successful nominees will be informed that they will stand for election by March 7.
- 3. Ballots to be sent to the membership on March 26
- 4. All nominees will be informed of the outcomes of the election by April 30, unless there is a tie. In that case, notification will occur by May 8.
